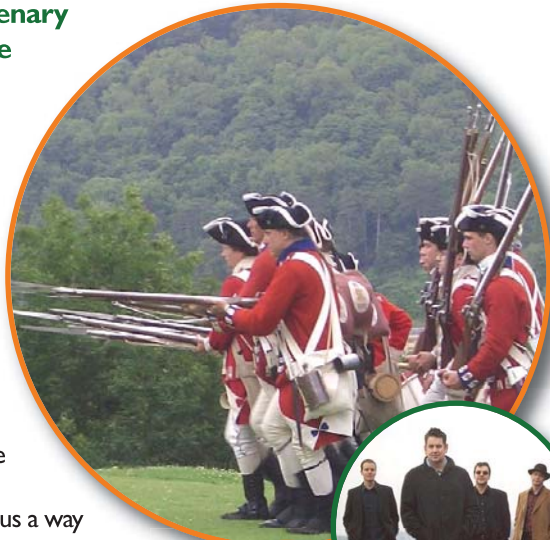

TOM PAINE (1737 - 1809)

Born the son of a Thetford corset-maker, Thomas Paine through his life and writings played a significant part in the development of the modern world.

He was a man who from an early age recognised injustice and challenged authority. He sought to redress grievances and gave voice to the aspirations of the ordinary man.

Paine was actively involved in both the American and French revolutions and through his pamphleteering and his major works *Common Sense*, *Rights of Man* and *The Age of Reason* drove the radical challenge to the eighteenth century order which has shaped the democracies of the modern world.
